

ELECTION RESULTS FOR 2016

The Election Committee, chaired by Marsha Schramm and Co-Chair Jackie Koyn along with Committee Members Lynda Weingart, Fred Rickert, Ruth Ann Rothbacher, Vince Schramm, Karen Bell, Theresa Rickert, Bob Thom, Deb Dolen & Walt Koyn conducted the counting of all the Ballots on Tuesday, November 15th, 2016. *A special Thank You to the Committee for undertaking the task to count the ballots is owed by the Association. It took approximately 8 hours or so for all the ballots to be counted.* The ballots counted were for the Board of Directors, proposed Rule & Regulation Changes along with the proposed By-Law Changes. The results are as follows:

BOARD of DIRECTORS – Total of Six Candidates eligible for Three, three-year terms.

Results are as follows; name, votes received and term of office:

1. Lee Campbell @ 327 (3 year term)
2. Donald J. Kalista @ 310 (3 year term)
3. Robert E. Klein @ 267 (3 year term)

The new Board Members will be sworn in at the next Organizational Board Meeting on Friday Dec. 2nd, 2016.

Vote tabulation for the balance of the Candidates is as follows:

5. Dan DeJoe @ 179

There were also Members with Write-Ins:

- Bob Brown received 13 votes

And several more members received 1 write-in vote.

RULES and REGULATIONS – A Total of eight (8) proposed Rule Changes were on the Ballot.

In Accordance with SECTION 16. AMENDMENTS to RULES and REGULATIONS: *“These Rules and Regulations may be amended or repealed and new Rules and Regulations may be adopted only by approval of two thirds (2/3rds) majority of the Members that exercise their vote.”*

BALLOT ITEM NUMBER ONE TOTAL OF 533 Ballot Votes Received

SECTION 2. BOATS, PARAGRAPH E. BOAT REGISTRATION, SUBPARAGRAPH 1

All boats being launched, docked at private or ILPOA docks or on lifts in the lake water of Indian Hills Subdivision are required to be registered with the Association Office and to display current ILPOA boat stickers purchased at a total cost of five dollars (\$5.00) which will be affixed on the left and right side of the boat next to owners lot numbers and which shall be no less than three inches (3”) high.

SECTION 16. AMENDMENTS TO RULES AND REGULATIONS

These Rules and Regulations may be amended or repealed and new Rules and Regulations may be adopted only by approval of four-sevenths ($\frac{4}{7}$ ths) majority of the Members that exercise their vote.

SECTION 3. LAKE RULES, PARAGRAPH B. SPEED LIMIT

Boating speed limit of forty miles per hour (40mph) will be from 9:00 am to 7:30 pm starting the Friday before Memorial Day through Labor Day, and 9:00 am to 6:00 pm starting the first Tuesday after Labor Day through the Thursday preceding Memorial Day. Other times, the speed shall be a maximum of five miles per hour (5 mph) with minimum wake.

SECTION 4. SKI, TUBE AND WAKEBOARD SAFETY. PARAGRAPH A

Skiing, tubing and wake boarding are allowed from 9:00 am to 7:00 pm starting the Friday before Memorial Day through Labor Day and 9:00 am to 6:00 pm starting the first Tuesday after Labor Day through the Thursday preceding Memorial Day. Boating speed limit of forty miles per hour (40 mph) will be from 9:00 am to 7:00 pm starting the Friday before Memorial Day through Labor Day and 9:00 am to 6:00 pm starting the first Tuesday after Labor Day through the Thursday preceding Memorial Day.

SECTION 4. SKI, TUBE AND WAKEBOARD SAFETY.

Proposed additions:

L. Wake surfing is prohibited. Wake surfing is defined as riding an artificial wave created by a boat without a rope.

M. All tow ropes must be at least 50' long.

PROPOSED NEW RULE: ADD SECTION 26. CULVERTS & DRAINAGE DITCHES

- A. Members are responsible for the maintenance, upkeep and cleaning of their culverts and drainage ditches so as to prevent any buildup or clogging of their culverts/drainage ditches resulting in rainwater runoff overflowing onto Association Roads and adjacent property.
- B. Failure by the Member to keep their culverts/ditches clean of debris (leaves, grass clipping and so forth) shall result in a letter being sent by the Board of Directors for corrective action. The Member has 30 days to comply with this request for corrective action as sent by Certified Mail.
- C. The Association shall clean the culverts/ditches of any Member who fails to comply within the 30 day time frame as set forth by the letter. Member shall then be billed for the actual costs (equipment and labor) to clean their culverts/ditches.

SECTION 9. VEHICLES, PARAGRAPH G.

PARAGRAPH G.

1. No vehicles whether it be a Member's vehicle, their guests, contractors or lawn service providers shall be allowed to park in such a manner that any of their wheels are actually resting on any road surface. No vehicle/trailer wheels are to be permitted on the road and instead must be actually parked on the Member's property.
2. Member who allows any type of parking on the road surface shall be issued a Warning Letter by the Board of Directors for the first offense. Second and subsequent offenses to this rule shall result in a Written Citation to the Member.
3. Member who provides any type of contract or lawn service to another Member and violates this rule shall also along with that Member, receive a Warning Letter for the first offense and Written Citations for the second and subsequent violations.
4. This rule does not apply to Service Vehicles such as Water Company, Cable, Telephone or Electrical who are making repairs to the utility systems. This rule also does not apply to Sanitation Trucks, Delivery Trucks such as UPS, Lowe's or Propane and so forth, who are making deliveries of 15 minutes or shorter.

SECTION 9. VEHICLES, PARAGRAPH H AND SECTION 10. GOLF CARTS, PARAGRAPHS A-F

Remove paragraph H from Section 9 and make changes to Section 10. Golf Carts.

SECTION 10. GOLF CARTS, ATV'S (All -Terrain Vehicle) and OTRV's (Over the Road Vehicle)

- A. Other than daylight hours, the golf cart, ATV or OTRV must have and use lights, front and rear, red brake lights and turn signals.
- B. The golf cart, ATV or OTRV must observe all traffic laws on the roads.
- C. The driver must be of legal age and show proof of driver's license, if requested by a Security Officer.
- D. The golf cart, ATV or OTRV will not be allowed to carry more than it has seats for. (No standing or more than three (3) passengers in a bench seat).
- E. The golf cart, ATV or OTRV MUST be driven on the right side of the roads and move over when other vehicles need to pass.
- F. Three inch (3") high lot numbers are required on the front and rear of the golf cart, ATV or OTRV.
- G. Golf carts, ATV's and OTRV are only permitted to be driven on roadways and are not to be driven through members property or on unpaved/un-graveled association property that is not owned by the driver or owner of said vehicle.

BY-LAWS – A Total of two (2) proposed Rule Changes were on the Ballot.

In accordance with ARTICLE XVII, AMENDMENTS to BY-LAWS: "These By-Laws may be amended or repealed and new By-Laws may be adopted by approval of a two third (2/3rds) majority of Members voting subject to the provisions of these By-Laws."

ARTICLE VIII. SECTIONS 6. BORROWING OF MONEY & SECTION 7. LIMITATIONS ON SPENDING

Spending shall be limited to approved budgeted items only. For new projects or plans, there is to be a vote of the Members and two-thirds (2/3rds) majority vote of all members in good standing who exercise their right to vote shall be required to proceed.

PRICE OF ASSOCIATION OWNED LOTS

Proposed Addition to By-Laws:

Association-owned lots that are made available for sale by the Board of Directors to Association members or any other interested buyer shall be sold for no less than a minimum price of \$10,000.00 The Board of Directors shall have the authority to increase the minimum price of \$10,000 from time to time, as it deems appropriate and necessary. However, the minimum price can only be lowered by a vote of the Association members, which shall require approval of a least two-thirds of those members who cast their ballot on the issue.

NOTE: A total of 974 ballots were mailed out to those “members in good standing” on October 26th, 2016. The Committee received a total of 542 Ballot Enveloped in the mail on November 15th, 2016. This amounts to 56% return rate from the members. As can be seen from the results, not everyone voted and those that “voted” did not necessarily vote on ALL the issues before them.
