2023: Year in Review

Maintenance

- Repaired Docks, cleared culverts, normal mowing and community maintenance
- Mowed dam and continue to address DNR maintenance requirements
- Continue road patching with ILPOA staff; have received >\$4k in reimbursements from Water Co.
- Partnered with Water Co (CSWR) to extend water repair agreement and establish open lines of communication regarding leak locations

CARE/Legal

- Successfully launched sales of Association owned lots selling 12 previously unsold lots
- Issued 101 citations (348% increase from 2022 and collected >\$2,000 in fines (187% increase from 2022)
- Successfully won 3 lawsuits for seriously past due accounts
- Lowest Past Due amount in decades (\$10k)
- Launch of CARE and improved security presence with ILPOA staff and Crawford County Sheriffs Department

Other

- Stocked lake for second consecutive year
- Funded community reserves for 4th consecutive year
- Generated >\$23k in revenue from new member fee
- Commissioned Reserve Study to help determine long term funding needs from an independent source
- Significant improvements in water quality driven by Lake Restoration (much improved e.Coli & Algae tests)

- // Lake Restorative Sciences will deliver comprehensive report in Q4 2023 detailing how the quality profile of our lake is changing and recommendations for 2024
- // Continue to maintain and run aeration system
- # Further testing and treatments will restart in March 2024

Lake Restoration: Results so far...

- Approx 420,000 cubic yards of muck removed
- Average increase in water depth of about 18 inches across the lake
- Significant reduction of harmful bacteria
- Reduction of harmful weeds
- Improved water clarity by 18 24 inches
- Improved fishing and overall ecosystem

July Road Assessment vote achieved 56% favorable, but short of 2/3 majority needed

Continue to evaluate options for funding road improvements

Expect further communication in Q4 as plans are developed

By-Laws

- #1 Simple Majority in 3 places
- #2 Attorney Fees Administrative Charge of \$150 if legal action brought

Rules & Regulations

- Rule 1 Increase fines for unauthorized watercraft on Lake \$250
- Rule 2 Limits on artificial weighting (wedges, water ballast tanks, etc.) of watercraft
- Rule 3 Funding Lake Restoration through increased Boat Sticker Fees
- Rule 4 Rental Dock Fees set by Board of Directors
- Rule 5 Excessive wake rule Citations/Fines up to & including banning
- Rule 6 Immediate fines for speeding on roads all vehicles immediate \$100



What are we voting on this year?

Rules & regulations continued

- Rule 7 Clarify rules to include Side by Sides and all other motorized vehicles
- Rule 8 Increase fines for rules violations and citations \$0, \$100, \$300
- Rule 9 Rules violations to be cited on per occurrence basis
- Rule 10 Fines for destruction of Association owned property
- Rule 11 Rules and Regulations to be changed by simple majority
- Rule 12 Lowering of the Lake

Ballots were mailed on October 13th Must be received at Post Office Box by November 16th
